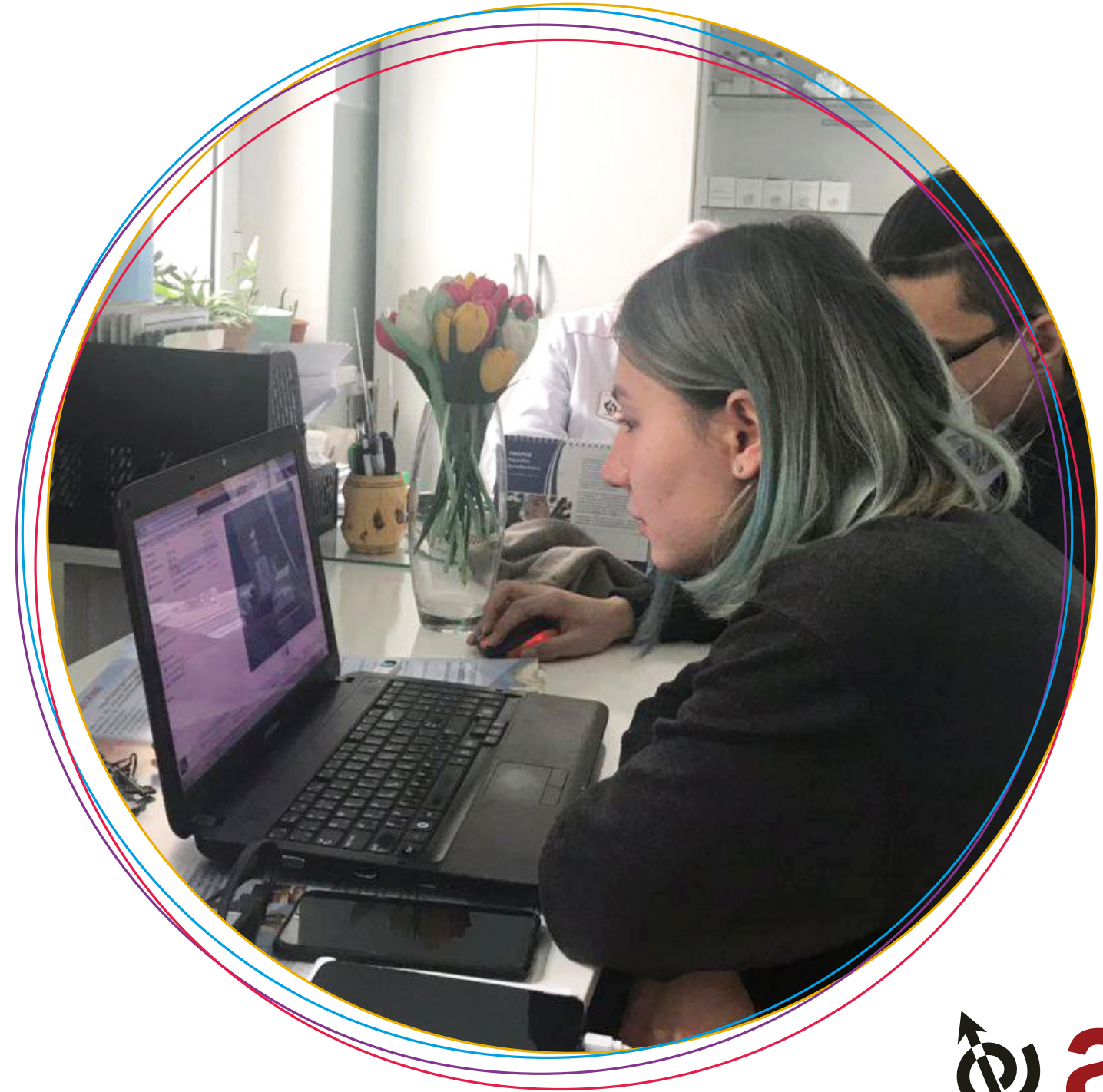

Challenges on SRHR and CSE

- ▶ COVID 19 pandemic reduced access to SRHR services and information
- ▶ Funding gap as funds redirected to COVID-19 programs
- ▶ Negative political developments and controversial amendments of the constitution





Adaptation

- ▶ Use of digital platforms (Instagram, Facebook, TikTok, Zoom)
- ▶ Strengthening referral system using online SRHR consultation
- ▶ Adaptation and development of the curricula for teachers and peer educators on menstrual hygiene and HIV/AIDS

Key Figures from 2020-2021



- ▶ **320 members registered** to RHAK youth network
 - ▶ **285** of these young people underwent basic training
 - ▶ **135** became peer trainers
- ▶ **40 promoters and online consultants**
 - ▶ provided advice to more than **600** clients during lockdowns alone

Key Figures from 2020-2021

- ▶ **10,945 young people and adolescents** received information and training on CSE and SRHR
- ▶ **More than 800 000 people** reached by positive messages via social media on CSE and SRHR topics
